<u>Community Organizations</u>: LCTV tax payers are not raising donations for a service that some can't use. Library budget is private and public totaling \$115,500. Is the Town prepared to raise \$5,000 for the above and LCTV?

<u>Contingency</u>: Selectboard, WBC has no comment until actual number is proposed.
