

**Transportation Committee Meeting
November 8, 2004**

Present: Don Jones, Lois Kwantz, Seaver Leslie, Marguerite Rafter

Absent: Sean Rafter

The meeting was called to order at 7:03 PM. We reviewed the minutes from the TC meeting of October 18th and the joint meeting of the TC and the board of selectmen on November 1st. After additions and corrections made to both sets of minutes, they were moved, seconded and adopted unanimously with said corrections. During the discussion of the 11-01-04 minutes, Marguerite stated that she wanted to be sure to bring to the attention of the comprehensive plan committee the issue that we had discussed with the board of selectmen concerning redefining the term "rural" as it appears in our plan/zoning ordinances. She also mentioned that there should be a discussion around the idea of **not** grandfathering existing businesses in terms of access management on state routes when such businesses change hands. The town will need to clarify whether the change should be defined as ownership or use of the property or both.

The rest of the meeting was spent reviewing Draft #2 of the transportation section for the comprehensive plan which Jeff Hinderliter had sent out to our committee. Don Jones had spent much time reviewing this document and brought us his suggested changes which the committee as a whole reviewed, modified, added to, etc. Seaver Leslie agreed to work on language that would incorporate the rural areas of the town as well so that the plan would be more inclusive and not focus primarily on the village alone. He said that he would get those pieces to Jeff Hinderliter on Tuesday. Don Jones stated that he was planning to meet with Jeff in order to present to him our suggestions/corrections, etc. for the transportation section which is scheduled to be presented to the whole comprehensive plan committee fairly soon.

After agreeing to wait to see if and when Jeff would like to meet with the TC before scheduling our next meeting, the committee adjourned at 10:20 PM.
