**F.** To authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer, on behalf of the Town, to accept gifts, real estate and other funds including trust funds that may be given or left to the Town and to apply these funds to the accounts the Selectmen deem appropriate;

**G.** To authorize the Selectmen to sell or dispose of various items, except real estate, that serve little or no purpose in the operation of the Town, and to apply the proceeds from these sales to the accounts the Selectmen deem appropriate;

**H.** To authorize the Selectmen to apply for and accept State and Federal grants, including Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) applications, and grants from non-profit organizations, donations or revenues, on the Town's behalf for municipal purposes, including, when necessary, the authority to sign grant contracts, documents or other

Article 69. Shall Article IX Regulations, Licenses and Permits Section 7 Improvements to Town Property be amended as follows:

> The Selectmen or the Town Manager at the Selectmen's direction, are authorized to grant permission to individuals or entities to do work on Town owned property <u>including the installation of trees</u>, <u>plaques</u>, <u>benches</u> <u>and memorials of any kind</u> at the individual's or entity's expense, upon such terms as the Selectmen or the Town Manager may direct, and to accept as Town property all materials incorporated in the work. [6-23]

Article 70. Shall Article IX Regulations, Licenses, and Permits Ordinance Section 9 Business License be amended as follows:

9.4 There shall be no fee for a business license The fee for a business license shall be set by the Wiscasset Fee Schedule [6-23]

Article 71. Shall Article X Miscellaneous Ordinance Section 1 Special Amusement Permit be amended as follows:

> 1.6 The fee for a special amusement permit shall be <u>\$10.00 set by the</u> <u>Wiscasset Fee Schedule</u> [6-23]

Article 72. Shall Article X Miscellaneous Ordinance Section 8 Automobile Junkyards, Automobile Graveyards, and Automobile Recycling Businesses be amended as follows:

> 8.5.4 <u>A nonrefundable fee of \$100 shall be submitted with the permit</u> application <u>A nonrefundable fee as determined by the Wiscasset Fee</u> Schedule shall be submitted with the application [6-23]

- Article 73. Shall the Town authorize the Selectmen to sell Map U-2 lot 77 otherwise known as the Red Brick School (Old Academy Building) located on Warren St at fair market value with the Right of First Refusal to be offered to the Maine Art Gallery?
